REGISTRATION

Online Registration is open and is due on or before **July 14th**. Registration will be limited to the first 96 coaches and youth. A state team consists of either 3 or 4 senior 4-H members or FFA contestants and 1 or 2 adult coaches/chaperones who are certified 4-H/FFA leaders from that state. Only one 4-H team per state <u>and</u> one FFA team per state may attend. Print the forms using your browser before you submit.

ADULT SCREENING & CHILD PROTECTION TRAINING

Texas 4-H rules require all adult chaperones be screened/background checked and complete <u>Child Protection Training</u> prior to participating in a multiple day, overnight event. This screening process and training include those associated with being a 4-H or FFA volunteer or a County Extension Agent or FFA advisor. You will be required to upload proof of your screening and training with registration. If your state program or employer does not require you to complete Child Protection training then please use the <u>Texas 4-H Child Protection</u>

ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE

Teams flying to the event have a few different options for nearby airports including Austin, TX (157 miles), or Dallas/Ft. Worth, TX (175 miles).

Registration and room check-in will start at 3:00 p.m. (CST). Specific information will be sent to the coordinating coach after registration. Plan on arriving between 3:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. (CST) on July 28th. Those arriving after 6:00 p.m. cannot be guaranteed supper on July 28th. Participants depart after breakfast on Wednesday, July 31.

LODGING

Lodging July 28 to July 31st will be held at the <u>Texas 4-H Conference Center</u>. Lodging will be arranged for up to 4 participants and 2 coaches or chaperones per team. Lodging will be cabins with bunk beds. The cabins are equipped with air-conditioning and a split bathroom. Lodging will be assigned by gender. Chaperones will be housed with their team members. Teams from multiple states will share cabins. **Participants and chaperones must bring their own bed linens, pillows, and towels**. Lodging for parents or chaperones other than the 2 registered will be the responsibility of individual attendees at local hotels or campgrounds.

OTHER ACCOMMODATIONS

We cannot accommodate non-participants at this event. Families and individuals other than the 2 coaches/chaperones are not allowed to participate in any of the Invitational events other than the Banquet and Awards Ceremony. Any family members or others who wish to attend the banquet and awards ceremony on Tuesday July 30th, can purchase extra tickets (\$25 each). This purchase must be added to the team registration form.

COACHES TOUR

The coaches' tour will take place on Tuesday, July 30th. Coaches/chaperones will spend the day visiting nearby attractions. All coaches/chaperones are required to participate in the tour to ensure that in the event of an emergency, coaches/chaperones can be located quickly.

EDUCATIONAL DAY

The Education Day will be Monday, July 29th, and will involve learning from Texas wildlife researchers and managers. Free time will follow the educational program in the late afternoon, and will include several options for on-site activities. Swimming will be available.
